

## USE THESE SAME SIMPLE PROCEDURES FOR ALL FROG SYSTEM STUDYPACKS

## Preparation:

Duplicate the Practice Sheet at the right or just use plain paper. Staple several copies or sheets together to make a booklet for each student. On the cover write the student's name and a list of the numbers of the Frog studypacks that the student is to practice independently.

Give each student a booklet and one studypack. Give the directions and monitor the work carefully at first, being certain that students are following the directions. Once the students learn the procedure, they can do ANY Frog studypack with minimal supervision.

## Instructions for students:

1. Write your name and the number (or name) of your Frog studypack on the lines on the first sheet. Put the studycards, question side up, in a neat stack beside your practice booklet.

2. Read the top card without picking it up. Write the correct answer on the first line. (Use A, B, or C. Don't write out the entire answer.)

3. Turn the card over and start a new stack. See the correct answer. You got it right, so give yourself some points for fun. The number on the back of the card tells you how many points to write on the line.

4. So you will know what to do if you make a mistake, do the next card and get it wrong on purpose. Then turn the card over and see that you got it wrong. Say to yourself, "I can learn that." Pick the card up and study the front so you will never forget the right answer. Put the card back in the middle of the first stack; you will get another try at it later. Make a dash on the point line; you'll get the points when the card comes up again.

5. Continue until all of the cards have been answered correctly, then sign your name and the date beside the studypack number on the cover of your book.

6. Return your studypack to the FROG SET. Put your practice booklet away or get another studypack from the FROG SET and do another assignment. The assignments may be done in any order.

## Note to teachers:

Points are used ONLY to provide the extra reinforcement some students need. They are not intended for competition or grading purposes.
